

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

There are often four Scripture passages at every Mass.

FIRST READING

Acts 10:44-48

While Peter was still speaking, the Holy Spirit fell upon all who heard the word. The circumcised believers who had come with Peter were astounded that the gift of the Holy Spirit had been poured out even on the Gentiles, for they heard them speaking in tongues and extolling God. Then Peter said, "Can anyone withhold the water for baptizing these people who have received the Holy Spirit just as we have?" So he ordered them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. Then they invited him to stay for several days.

People: Thanks be to God.

PSALM Cantate Domino Psalm 98

8:00, the psalm is prayed responsively at the half-verse (*).
10:30, the Choir will chant this 1549 translation attributed to Bishop of Exeter, Myles Coverdale, found in all earlier editions of the Book of Common Prayer.

EPISTLE

1 John 5:1-6

The epistle reading usually comes from one of the Letters of St. Paul.

Everyone who believes that Jesus is the Christ has been born of God, and everyone who loves the parent loves the child. By this we know that we love the children of God, when we love God and obey his commandments. For the love of God is this, that we obey his commandments. And his commandments are not burdensome, for whatever is born of God conquers the world. And this is the victory that conquers the world, our faith. Who is it that conquers the world but the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God?

This is the one who came by water and blood, Jesus Christ, not with the water only but with the water and the blood. And the Spirit is the one that testifies, for the Spirit is the truth.



GOSPEL


John 15:9-17

The Holy Gospel is the pinnacle of the Liturgy of the Word; hence, standing. Many have adopted the custom of making the sign of the cross on the forehead, lips, and heart during the announcement, whereby we ask for the Word of Our Lord to be in our minds, on our lips, and in our hearts.



Jesus said to his disciples, "As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete.

"This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you. I do not call you servants any longer, because the servant does not know what the master is doing; but I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father. You did not choose me but I chose you. And I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last, so that the Father will give you whatever you ask him in my name. I am giving you these commands so that you may love one another."





SERMON

NICENE CREED

Formulated over two ecumenical councils in 325 and 381 A.D., the Nicene Creed is the summary of Christian belief, sometimes called the Symbol of the Faith. The Creed's focus is our Lord as both fully God (divine) and fully man (human).

For all who have died + that they be one with our Heavenly Father for all eternity, Let us pray to the Lord....


All: Lord, have mercy.


THE HOLY COMMUNION

SURSUM CORDA



SANCTUS & BENEDICTUS

The Sanctus and Benedictus (Latin for "holy" and "blessed") is one of the earliest elements of the liturgy (St. Clement of Rome—fourth Bihop of Rome, +104—mentions it) and concludes the Preface. It is the hymn of the seraphim in Isaiah 6:3 that never ceases before God, in which we now join. This hymn is sung by our cantors at 10:30am.




LORD'S PRAYER

Celebrant: And now, as our Savior Christ hath taught us, we are bold to say:



THE FRACTION

The Celebrant breaks the Eucharistic Bread or Host (from the Latin for "victim"), recalling Christ's gesture of breaking bread at the Lat Supper. The priest then puts a piece of the host into the chalice ("commingles," a rite dating from the eighth century) to signify the unity of the living and glorious Body and Blood of the Lord in the work of salvation, often saying inaudibly a he/she does so: "May this mingling of the body and blood of our Lord Jesu Christ bring eternal life to us who receive it."



Invitation

Celebrant: Behold the Lamb of God, behold him that taketh away the sins of the world.

People: Lord, I am not worthy that thou shouldest come under my roof.

But speak the word only and my soul shall be healed.

AGNUS DEI

This chant has been sung since the 7th century. It is based upon John the Baptist's reference to Jesus (John 1:29): "Behold the Lamb of God that takest away the sins of the world," which the priest just echoed in presenting the consecrated bread and wine to the congregation.

All baptized Christians are welcome to receive Holy Communion. Kneeling (or standing) at the Communion rail, we receive the Host (consecrated bread) on the out-stretched right palm of the hand (supported underneath by the left palm). The Priest (or Deacon) will not place the Host on the tongue. You are also invited, if you so desire, to receive the consecrated wine from the common Chalice. Two options for the Chalice (which will be held by the acolyte): 1) Raise/tilt it, from the base, to your lips; 2) Dip the host (not fingers!) in the wine (intinction). If you prefer not to receive the consecrated wine, discreetly shake your head "no".

If you are not receiving Communion, you are invited to come forward for a blessing (indicated by crossing yourarms over your chest).

If you have not been baptized and find yourself drawn to Jesus Christ and life in Him, please let a member of leadership know. We would be honored to have a conversation with you about your faith journey, or questions you may have regarding the sacrament of Baptism.
